### Competitive impact

Trango's competitors in embedded hypervisors are **Open Kernel Labs** (OK Labs) and **VirtualLogix**. OK Labs was founded in August 2006 as a spinoff from government-backed think tank **National Information and Communications Technology Australia** (NICTA). The company maintains an R&D team in Sydney and headquarters in Chicago. Cofounder and CEO Steve Subar was entrepreneur-in-residence at NICTA.

OK Labs recently updated its embedded hypervisor for mobile devices in OKL4 3.0 and a new compatible offering, OKL4 Nano, for low-end devices. The company, which says its software runs on nearly 250 million phones in the market, seeks to address the fragmentation and multiplicity in the mobile space with its embedded hypervisor.
